Your First Class

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Outcomes: By the end of this session, participants will be able to...

- Develop strategies for making your first class go well
- Recognize the value in setting the tone / classroom environment in your first class with students
- Understand the role of a TA / instructor in adding value to student learning

Before Your First Class:

Make a checklist of beginning course items (e.g., syllabus, handouts, etc.)
Make a plan for the class

Strategies for Dealing with Pre-Class Nerves:

Practice in advance
Dress comfortably (but professionally)
Talk to students before class
Begin class with some discussion questions

The Day of Your First Class:

Make a plan for the day- leave time for any last minute prep work
Find your class (is it somewhere you already know?)
Try to relax and briefly review your course plan right before the class

During Your First Class:

- Offer Added Value
 - Teach! Give students a reason to come back!
 - Facilitated discussion, interactive lecture, classroom demonstration
 - Be an engaging link between experts and novices
 - o Link labs, recitation sections, or other assignments to the lecture

- o Give students friendly tips and advice about resources
- Create an Enjoyable Classroom Environment
 - Make an inclusive classroom
 - activities that help students share and connect with the material
 - Provide thoughtful responses in class
 - LARA method
 - Be mindful of tone and body language
- Motivate Your Students
 - Connect material to students' interests
 - Provide authentic, real-world tasks
 - Show relevance to their lives and careers
 - Show your own passion & excitement for the material (+ the value you place on the subject / field)
 - Describe effective study strategies
 - Use personal statements (e.g., "I would approach this problem by...")
